

Organisation works for nurturing and uplifting the destitute by providing the necessary Seminars and Awareness programs, Income Generation Projects, SED (Social and Economic Development) projects, Cycle Distribution, Medical Help, Social Service Training Centre, and Relief Distribution during critical times.

Its works and contributions already transformed the lives of many in states like Odisha, Bihar and West Bengal through launching several projects in remote villages benefitting thousands of underprivileged people. Following is the succinct information of the major projects conducted by the organization in 2024-2025.

Bridge School // Tuition Centers



Titliguri, Dist- Darjeeling, West Bengal



Kumarpara, Dist- South 24 Pgs, West Bengal

Students for free Tuition Centre come from different social, economic and religious backgrounds. Economically, majority of them are from low income-working class families, mainly cattle rearing and farming. So, majority of the children are not in a position to afford schooling. Socially, children from high and low class communities rarely mingle with each other. The only platform where they can socialize and interact is at the Bridge school and Tuition centers. Due to low income and status, some children are not able to go to school. Bridge Schools and children Tuition Centres are the place where every child can learn. SEED has reached more than 170 children, offering them free education and providing them with their study materials.

Income Generation Projects

SEED has also rendered financial aid and service to the people who are desperate and in miserable condition. It has given a one-time investment to the people and encouraged them to generate income out of it. The beneficiaries are of different classes of needy people, such as widows, the destitute, the poor, etc.

It has provided projects like Fancy shop, Saloon, Parlor, Grocery Shop, Garments Shop, Chicken Farm, piggery Project, Cycle Repairing Shop, Jewelry Shop, Ice-cream stall and many others to the people in different regions of Odisha, West Bengal, and Bihar. It has reached more than 130 families (650 individual beneficiaries) providing them with strong income source. Following is the brief information of projects conducted in various places.

Auto Rickshaw Manu Kumar, Maffsil Manpur, Gaya, Bihar



Manu Kumar lives with his wife and children in Gaya district, Bihar. He is from Maffsil village. But due to a land dispute issue he left his hometown with his family. He has nothing in his hand now. It was so difficult for him to sustain his family with two young children. So, considering all these factors SEED has given him an Auto Rickshaw for his livelihood.



I am Manu Kumar from Maffsil, Gaya, Bihar. I have a wife and two children. Due to a land issue, my family members and brothers sent me away from home. I came outside thinking that I can find a job and sustain my family, but I could not get any job. I was not able to stay outside nor able to go home. It was so pathetic and my wife was also worried. When I heard about SEED and reached for help, they visited and understood my condition and gave me this Auto rickshaw. I cannot explain how much I am thankful and grateful to SEED for their great help.

Income Generation Projects

Four Wheeler Thela Manoj Kumar Andherichhok, Korpi, Bihar



Manoj Kumar is from Andherichhok Korpi district Bihar. He lives with his family in this place. He and his wife could not take good care of their children because there was lack of job opportunity. He is skillful in making fast food. As the beneficiary was struggling to earn income and finding it difficult to meet the family needs due to no income, SEED has provided IGP assistance to improve their family income generation.

Manoj was seeking financial assistance to establish a business with a fast-food stall. Thus, SEED team has provided raw materials and a pushcart for the fast-food business. Now they are earning 1000-1500/- per day. SEED is happy to witness his small-scale business growing. Family has also expressed their gratitude to the team and the management for helping them to be established.



Income Generation Projects

Grocery Shop Prabhat Mallick, Daringbadi Kandhamal, Odisha



Prabhat Mallick is from Kandhamal, Odisha. He has six members in his family and is a hard-working person. But he was not getting any job that can sustain his family, and his children were almost starving. So, SEED recognized his condition and helped him with a Grocery Shop for his family survival and a steady income source.

Earlier, he and his family were living in a very miserable condition but after getting this project he is happy. He and his family are having a good income from this grocery shop. He is earning more than 700-1000/- per day. His family needs are met and he has developed this shop.

I am Prabhat Mallik from Kandhamal, Odisha. I have a big family. From the time of Covid, my family condition was getting worse. I was unable to find a good job to earn and run my family. But SEED looked at our hopeless condition and provided us with the Grocery shop with enough materials. And thus, my business was started. My family and I are so happy, because our family depends on this business only. I am so thankful to SEED for their generous help and love.

Income Generation Projects

Grocery Shop Nikhil Kumar, Gaya, Bihar



Nikhil Kumar lives with his family and parents in Gaya, Bihar. Being the eldest son, the family's complete responsibility is on him. He had looked for all the possibilities to get a job with a stable income to sustain his family but could not find a job. So, he started welding works but that caused discomfort to his eyes. In this time of helpless condition when the entire family is worried, SEED helped the family and provided a grocery shop to Nikhil Kumar.

He had no income source to take care of his parents and family. Almost a year, scarcity had ruined their life but when he got the grocery shop from SEED, he was so thrilled and gradually his business developed.

I am Nikhil Kumar from Gaya, Bihar. I have my parents and family. We struggled so much in life. We do not have any crop from the land due to water crisis. I had been outside, living away from home, to earn income but due to eye problem I could not continue my work. In our despair situation, this organisation came and helped my family by giving this grocery shop. We thank this organization so much. Thank you so much, SEED.

Income Generation Projects

Cosmetic Shop Sushil Kumar, Arwel, Bihar



Sushil Kumar and his family members worked as laborers in the village. But it so happened that his elder son, the sole breadwinner in the family, passed away due to some illness. And the family was totally broken. As they aged, the parents' health declined due to grief. They have two daughters also. So this family had nothing in their life and SEED gave this Cosmetic shop for their survival and income source.

Sushil Kumar and his family is now able to run a small- scale business of cosmetic shop which is highly in demand in their region. Through this IGP assistance he is now able to earn twenty thousand rupees a month and sometimes even more. Family is now stable financially and is able to take care both their daughters' education.



I am Sushil Kumar from Arwel Bihar. I am so thankful to SEED for their gracious help. Now we are able to sustain only because of SEED and their help. Losing my son was the biggest loss but we are taking heart to live on through this business.

Income Generation Projects

Heat Press Machine Chunwibou Ringkangmai, Siliguri, WB



Chunwibou Ringkangmai is from Manipur and came to Siliguri with his wife in search of work. He was poor and from the below poverty line (BPL) category. He did not have any business or source of income and even not getting any job opportunity. He found it difficult to sustain his family and meet the needs of his children. Therefore, SEED has noticed his helpless condition and given him a hot press machine.

Now the family members are very happy and well able to manage the family needs. They are also growing day by day in their economy. He is able to meet the needs of his children and even their education.



I am Chunwibou Ringkangmai from Manipur but settled in Siliguri. I am so thankful to SEED for providing me this Hot Press Machine by which I can make different designs of T-Shirts and other cloth Items both for male and female. Our beginning was Zero, but I never gave up hope. My wife and I struggled so much in our lives but at the end, SEED noticed our struggles and came to help us. Thank you, SEED. Now the business is running good and has picked up well.

Income Generation Projects

Computer and Xerox Shop

Madhumita Hait, Khanakul area, Dist. Hooghly, WB



Madhumita and her husband are a middle-aged couple and have a son. They are poor and sustain on their daily wages. He had to quit working after doctors diagnosed a heart problem. So, Madhumita's financial problem increased and due to it she was mentally broken because her husband was the only breadwinner in the family. So, as their financial condition deteriorated, Madhumita Hait had no hope to survive. Seeing their pathetic condition SEED reached and helped them by providing a computer and a photoprint [Xerox] machine.



After getting this computer and the Xerox machine her days of sadness were replaced with joy. Her son who is studying 11th standard also operates computer for DTP and handles other works. So both mother and son mostly spend time in the shop to raise the income. Now her income is around 15,000/- per month, which is unexpected and unbelievable. Now through this money, her family is running smoothly, and her husband's treatment is going very well, and through this shop, Madhumita's and her family's lifestyle has changed.

Income Generation Projects

Beauty Parlor Rangapani, Dist-Darjeeling, West Bengal



Meena Shyangden Barman is from Rangapani, Darjeeling who lives with her husband and two children. They are very poor family. She and her family had to struggle a lot in a Tea garden. They faced lot of injustice in the Tea garden in terms of payment and hard labor. So, they left that place and were struggling a lot. Finally, they approached SEED who helped in opening a Beauty Salon. The shop started running well and they got many customers. Even she hired one worker to help her.



I am Mrs. Barman and so happy to have this shop. I really thank SEED for their wonderful help and because of their help my business growing. I could have never earned this much in the Tea garden. It is all because of SEED that my family and I are prospering. Thank you SEED.

SOCIAL & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (SED) PROJECTS

One of the major contributions and essential goals of SEED is to uplift the poor and their socio-economic condition through various projects. There are different Projects such as Band Party, Flower Garden, Sewing Centres, Paper Plate project, Incense sticks Project, and many more that have been initiated by SEED. These projects are usually executed in a community or among a group of people by analysing their needs and the availability of local resources. It is operational after forming a Self-Help Group so that they can be united and live in harmony and also obtain loans on a subsidy from Banks for further projects. Here are a few projects launched in the poor and needy communities in different areas. There are more than 100 skill development projects (1000 beneficiaries) set up by SEED for the people, mainly for women to self-sustain and support the family. A few highlights are exemplified here below.

Sewing Centre Project for 5 families Silliguri, WB



Around five families living in north corner of Silliguri of West Bengal are extremely poor and needy. They do not have any source of income. All they have is the skill of stitching. Sonia, who is very skillful, had one small sewing machine.

She used to stitch old torn garments and was teaching a few people who were interested in learning stitching. Noticing the poor conditions of Sonia and the need of other people in that area, SEED provided them some machines. Her ambition is to uplift people and make a difference in the society.

SOCIAL & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (SED) PROJECTS

Sewing Centre Project for 5 families Silliguri, WB



With the SEED provided sewing machines Sonia taught other women in the locality, and they started generating income for themselves with their growing shop of stitched clothes. In that way she became expert in designs and fabrication and empowered some villagers.

Now her business is well established. She stitches different designer cloths and even the bridal gowns. She stitched her own bridal gown for her wedding. Her stitched materials are being marketed beyond Silliguri, her hometown.

I am Sonia Chhote from Dajeeling but staying in Silliguri. I was an orphan but taken care by my uncle. And he took care of my education. I wanted to do something without bothering my uncle. So I choose to stitch cloths. And I wanted people also to have improved economy instead of sitting idle in homes. I formed a team of five families. And as I was teaching them, SEED noticed my zeal and labor and gave me these machines. I improved my skill and gradually took this business step by step along with these five families for better income. Now our business is top class.

SOCIAL & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (SED) PROJECTS

Tailoring Centre Mohania Rhotas Bihar



Around 10 families, living in a very poor condition were selected in Rhotas, Bihar. In the village due to their poverty, they have not been given equal position in the society. Their children were not able to go school due to financial struggles. Thus, SEED has visited them and observed their poor condition and has planned to give them one Tailoring Centre.

SEED has provided them six machines. There are ten women in this project, one from each family. In this project the ladies not only they learn but they earn an income by stitching the clothes and mosquito nets. So, in this way they are working as a team towards socio-economic development.

Through this Tailoring centre ten women and their families are benefitting by selling their finished products. Starting a saving scheme, they are now contributing a little amount of Rs. 100 to 200, monthly, and depositing it in a bank thus saving amount for their future needs.

Rhotas, Bihar

I am Mrs. Anita Devi from Bhardava, Rhotas , Bihar. I live with my husband and a child. I am so happy to be part of this tailoring centre. I knew basic stitching and was earning a small income. With a machine that was bought by my husband I was stitching old cloths of customers and was getting a little money. After joining this group, I learnt it well. My husband was also surprised that I learned within a few months. In our group we are stitching mosquito nets, accessories for sarees and skirts etc. Thank you, SEED for giving us this opportunity that we can add something to our house economy.

Community Development

SEED has worked hard even in the midst of critical situations to help in community development works like repairing the community halls, distributing cycles to the poor, providing tube wells in the community where there is scarcity of potable water, and so many other activities for the benefit of the society in different regions of different states in India.

SEED has helped in constructing houses for the poor people and in certain places it has given them roofing material. Altogether 530 beneficiaries have enjoyed these benefits. Here's some succinctly labeled information.

Community Hall Repairing Ramnagar, West Champaran, Bihar (for 20 families)



There are 20 families in Ramnagar Village of West Champaran, Bihar who did not have any common hall for their community to celebrate festivals or to conduct any events or have get togethers. These beneficiaries are from poor background and daily laborer's families.



SEED helped to build this community Hall although so much of work was pending here. SEED has provided some materials for it and It is going to be finished very soon.

Community Development

Raghob Kumar House Construction at Jahanabad, Bihar



Raghob and his wife are from an interior village in Jahanabad, Bihar. They both are daily wage laborers. Many times, both of them felt helpless as they were not able to build a house. They have suffered a lot from rain and their children were always disturbed because of the ruined thatch and broken wall. Considering their pitiful condition, SEED has helped them construct this house where they now live securely.



I am Rambha Devi from Jahanabad and I thank SEED for helping me and my family so much. We were not able to have a good house to lay our head. But SEED looked at our helpless situation and helped with a proper house. Thank you, SEED.

Bicycle Distribution

West Champaran, Bihar



SEED has looked for the welfare of the people those who are very poor and needy in the community where there is no transportation facility. The beneficiaries are very poor, living in remote villages. Their families struggle to travel as there is no public transport in their area. People who have bikes are able to move around freely. Since they are poor and could not afford even bicycle and some times they borrow from others. They have to go to another village for work and to earn a living, hence, the beneficiaries needed the bicycle. Therefore, SEED has supported them with bicycles. More than 21 bicycles were provided.

My name is Mr. Gagan Kumar. I really want to thank the SEED team for giving this bicycle to my family. Including my children, we all are very happy and thankful to the organization. If SEED had not provided me with this bicycle, I wouldn't be able to afford it. With this bicycle I will work hard and provide for my family.

Water Pump

SEED is also deeply concerned with the people's lives and agriculture. It has sanctioned six water Pumps for six communities where nearly 300 people have been benefitted.

Bal Samrat Kumar, Arwel, Bihar



The beneficiary families are economically poor, and jobless. For the survival they sell firewood. There is no farming as usually the agricultural lands get dried up because of the scarcity of water.
